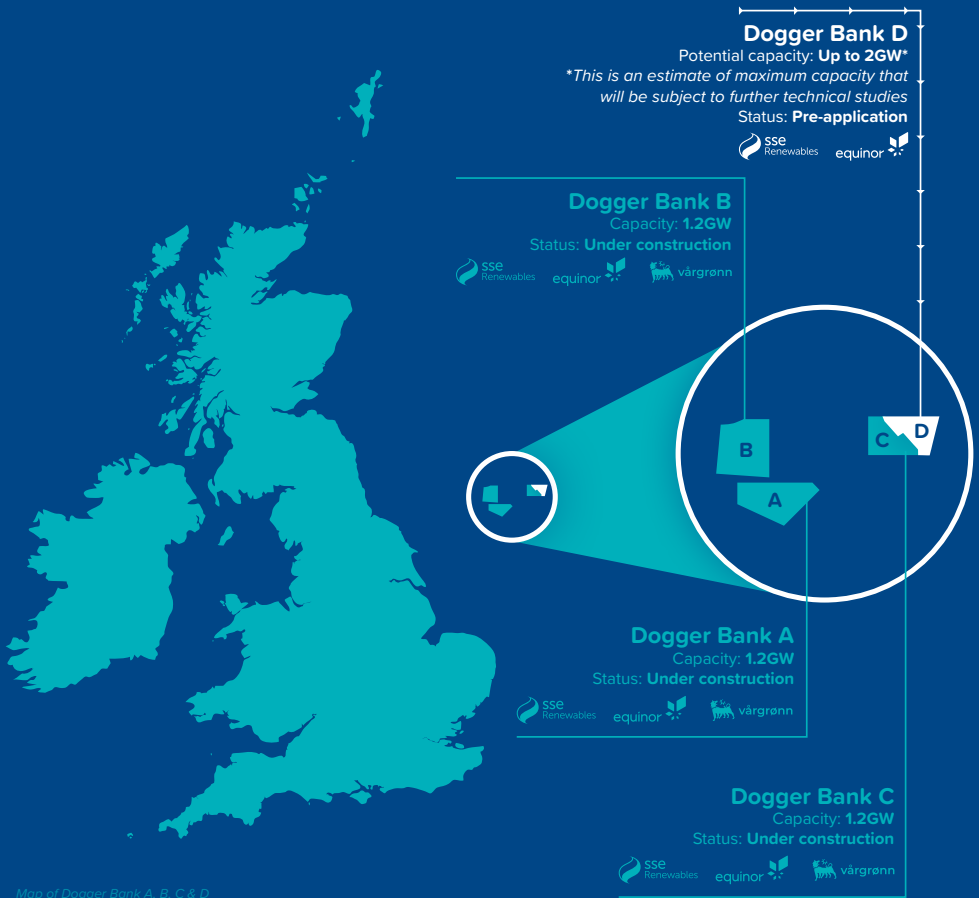

Dogger Bank D is a new proposed offshore wind farm that will connect to the UK power grid in East Riding of Yorkshire.

It is a potential fourth phase of the Dogger Bank Wind Farm, the world's largest offshore wind farm. You are receiving this introduction to the project as your home or business is close to the areas we are considering for Dogger Bank D.

Dogger Bank D is being developed by a 50 / 50 joint venture between SSE Renewables and Equinor, two of the world's leading companies in the development and operation of offshore wind energy.

Our proposals for Dogger Bank D

We understand that people living and working in East Riding of Yorkshire have a wealth of knowledge to share and we welcome your feedback. Our consultation is designed to gather comments and suggestions on our proposals.

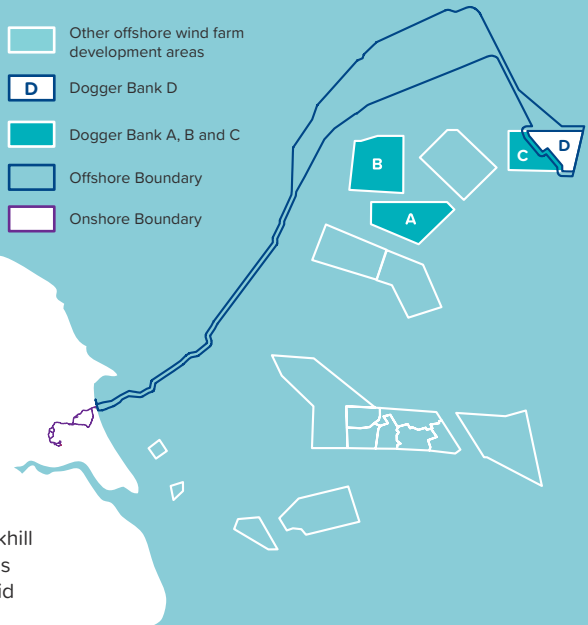
Offshore

At sea, there could be up to 112 turbines, depending on the size of turbine selected, positioned 210km from the northeast coast of England at the closest point to shore.

An offshore export cable will connect the offshore turbines to a landfall location near Skipsea to transmit the generated electricity.

Onshore

Whilst we are still at an early stage of the project, we have progressed with identifying potential options for routing of the underground onshore cables and locations for siting the converter station. The onshore cables will connect to a new substation at Birkhill Wood between Beverley and Cottingham. This substation is being developed by National Grid and does not form part of our proposals.



How we will progress Dogger Bank D

As part of the project development process, we are gathering data and undertaking offshore and onshore surveys. We are talking to landowners and local communities, which will help us to understand the natural environment and what matters to those affected by our proposals. We will be looking at ways to keep disturbance to people and wildlife to a minimum, such as the route of cables avoiding residential areas, minimising impacts on natural surroundings and road traffic disruption.

As Dogger Bank D is recognised as a strategic national asset for energy with an expected generating capacity greater than 100MW, it qualifies as a Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project (NSIP). We will follow the procedures set out in The Planning Act 2008 which provides the framework for how NSIPs are developed.

Part of this framework includes assessing the offshore and onshore environment and the process of undertaking an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA). As part of the EIA process, we will carry out a preliminary environmental impact assessment. This assessment will represent a point in the assessment process when the design of the project is still in development and the likely significant effects are continuing to be understood.

We will hold a second phase of consultation in 2025, where we will formally consult on the preliminary environmental impact assessment work we've completed and our refined proposals for Dogger Bank D.
